

VETTING OF UON STAFF KICKS OFF

The University of Nairobi has started vetting all its employees. The vetting process kicked off today 21st March 2016, with the ICTC staff taking their oath of confidentiality during the morning session.

The Vice Chancellor also urged the members to read the code of conducts and ethics and any other instruments given to them.

Mr Tim Mweseli the presiding advocate took the staff through the process of swearing, after which all the members present signed the oath of confidentiality form.
